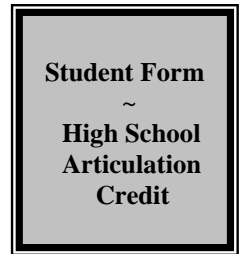




**Student Form

Leading to an Associate Degree at Cuyahoga Community College:

For the purposes of this agreement, a Polaris Career Center student is defined as a student who is enrolled in and successfully completed the prescribed curriculum pathway for grades 9-12. This pathway has been identified and approved by high school and college administrators as a curriculum that provides the students with the academic and technical competencies that have been developed through a Career Field Standards Document review process or similar procedure. This process ensures a seamless learning progression of technical and academic skills from high school to college.

TO RECEIVE CREDIT THE STUDENT MUST:

1. Successfully complete the approved Polaris Career Center's Teaching Professions program with a minimum of a 3.0 cumulative average in the program as verified by a Polaris Career Center official on the Officer's Certificate of Warranty (see below)
2. Earn a minimum "B" average on portfolio
3. Earn a 9-12th grade cumulative G.P.A. of 2.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
4. Pass Algebra 2 (or equivalent) prior to graduation from high school
5. Minimum 95% attendance as verified by Polaris Career Center official on Officer's Certificate of Warranty (see below)
6. Submit completed Cuyahoga Community College application to the Office of Admissions and Records
7. Admission to the College within 12 months of graduation from Polaris Career Center's Teaching Professions program
8. Request an official final high school transcript be sent to Cuyahoga Community College
9. Submit this Student Form for High School Articulated Credit with ALL required signatures to the Office of Admissions and Records, Western Campus ATTN: Rebecca Wyatt

NO CREDIT WILL BE AWARDED UNTIL THE STUDENT MEETS ALL OF THE ABOVE CONDITIONS

Students who successfully meet the above requirements will receive course credit, tuition free, for the following college course. These credits may be applied towards the College's Associate Degree programs where applicable to meet degree requirements.
